getting started

REGISTRATION:

Register snowmobiles with the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), even if it is registered in another state or province. Carry registration and proof of insurance at all times while snowmobiling. Holders of snowmobile safety certificates must have the certificate in their possession when snowmobiling. PARKING AREAS:

LONG LAKE—NYS DEC State Boat Launch on Olivet Rd (old Dock Road), Kickerville Mobil. Weekends only park at Long Lake Central School Parking Lot, Mt. Sabattis (except Martin Luther King Weekend). Lake Eaton is best for Route 30—Newcomb Trail best accessed by State Boat Launch (Olivet Road). Open parking available on Route 30 past 1st Sabattis entrance (county route 10). Parking is available on the main road near the LL Town Beach and check at area businesses for more information.

RAQUETTE LAKE—Parking available in the center of town along the water near RL Supply, the library and the WW Durant. Please inquire within the Tap Room for best place to park and store your trailer. Limited parking available during Ice Harvest and Winter Carnival Weekend. Check in at local businesses for other parking options.

LONG LAKE AREA TRAILS

Sabattis To Long Lake Hamlet (NYS C7B)
(25 total miles to Long Lake) 11.5 mi. from C7 (Rail Corridor) to Route 30. Follow County Road 10. Stay on the banked, groomed trails. Whitney Wilderness and Lake Lila Road are CLOSED TO ALL MOTORIZED VEHICLES. At Sabattis Rd and Route 30—Cross Route 30 and turn immediately to the south along the shoulder of the Route 30 for about 1.2 miles. The trail leaves route 30 to follow a series of logging roads, skid roads and woods. As soon as the trail re-intersects with Route 30 (8.3 miles from Sabattis Road, 1.5 miles from Lake Eaton) there will be shoulders and narrow bridges along the Route 30 Roadway. The trail leaves the shoulder and enters private property for a short distance before reaching Lake Eaton. As the trail turns east, reduce speed. Trail is narrow. This area is about 3.5 miles in length. When traveling on Kickerville Road—use the shoulder, watch out for cars and GO SLOW. This is a heavily populated area. Trails on Kickerville and Rice Road (both town roads) will intersect with route 30.

- RIDE AT YOUR OWN RISK.
- No permit fee for trails in Long Lake/Raquette Lake.
- All town & county Rds in Long Lake and Raquette Lake are designated snowmobile trails.
- It is unlawful to operate a snowmobile on any of the NY State highways, Rt 28N or Rte 30, except at designated X-rings. Make X-rings at an angle of approximately 90 degs. You are allowed to travel up to 500 yds. on a main highway to reach trail heads.
- CHECK WITH LOCAL RESIDENTS FOR INFO ON ICE AND LAKE SAFETY. Designated snowmobile trails DO NOT cross bodies of water.
- Please do not litter or damage trails.
- All Terrain Vehicles (ATV's) are forbidden on all trails.
- Be prepared. Winter weather changes quickly in the ADKS. Wear proper clothing, helmets, goggles.
- Cell phone coverage is very limited. Always tell a friend where you are riding or ride in a group.
- Obey all signs. Many trails are narrow, wet, and have downed limbs after storms. Beware of blind spots.
- Many trails are on private property and state land. Please obey all signs and property restrictions. Protect this privilege. Do not veer off the trail.
- Many trails on NY State Land have strict 8 feet width restrictions. Please slow down in narrow corridors.
- If studding in the early season, please note there will be rough areas before we obtain a good snowpack.

GENERAL SNOWMOBILE INFO



Endion/Lake Eaton Entrance (S86)
5.1 miles. This trail begins on Route 30 north of Long Lake at Lake Eaton Campsite entrance. At about 1.5 miles from the campsite entrance is an intersection. The fork to the right (northeast) is the S86/C7B link. The trail to the left (west) is the 4.5 mile link to Endion Road. S86 intersects with Endion Road providing access to the south end of Long Lake. Turn north (left) on Endion Road to lead back to Route 30. For directions to the Hamlet of Long Lake, pop into Kickerville Mobil for directions. Friendly folks.

Lake Eaton Entrance to (C7B -S86)

0.8 miles. Trail provides a link from the Lake Eaton Campsite Entrance to Corridor Trail C7B. The east trail at the intersection leads to Long Lake, the west trail leads to C7 at Sabattis station.

3 Mile Spur (S86)

0.8 miles. This trail provides a quick link from C7B to the Endion Road/Lake Eaton Entrance trail. It crosses Route 30 so use caution.

Long Lake- Raquette Lake (NYS C8B) Power line Trail
Start at Mt. Sabattis Park/Ice Skating rink across from Post Office and Corner Motel. Proceed up trail to the pavilion. Trail starts at the back of the pavilion near the small building. Follow the power line for 1.5 miles. It turns left into the woods to follow an old skid road and continues for about .75 miles and rejoins the power line. While travelling on Power Line stay out of private property. Please DO NOT ride in private sanctity which at one time was used as a shortcut to the lake. Follow the power line route on to cross Rte 28N/30. to intersect with North Point Road.

Northpoint Road (NYS C8B)

7.9 miles to the Lower Sargent Pond trailhead. Corridor trail C8B continues on the North Point Road to a trail 1.8 miles past the bridge over the Raquette River or about 2.5 miles past the Lower Sargent Pond Trailhead. The trail is on the left side of the road. This 0.4 mile trail goes south to the shore of Raquette Lake. Travel on the lake can be dangerous. The current at the end of the lake can be THIN ICE and slushy. Check locally on ice conditions before crossing the lake. Ride at your own risk.

North Point Road-Sargent Ponds-Tiogga Point (L8B)
2.1 mi. from North Point Road to Lower Sargent Pond. 3.5 miles from Lower Sargent to Tiogga Point. This trail goes through NYS Wild Forest Land. This is NOT GROOMED—and it is a narrow trail.

Side Trip Off North Point Road Corridor Trail (L8B)
Forked Lake Campsite Road 1.7 mi. North Point Road to campsite. This side trip, just past Buttermilk Falls, off the

Raquette Lake-Eighth Lake (L8B)

2.3 miles to Uncas/Browns Tract Road at Upper Pond. 2.9 miles to head of Eighth Lake. Start in Raquette Lake Village and travel along the Dillon Road (abandoned railway bed) which follows the course of Browns Tract Inlet. At about 1.7 miles from the village after crossing the stream, you will come to an intersection. The right fork will lead you to the

Bug Lake Trail & Loop (L8B)

The Bug Lake Trail starts at Eighth Lake Campsite (off Route 28). It proceeds north across a foot bridge over the Eighth Lake Outlet and by Bug Lake to end at the Uncas/Browns Tract Road or veer to the right for a loop setting you closer to RL Village center

RIDE TRAILS IN TOWN OF WEBB AND TOWN OF INLET.

Brown's Tract/Uncas Road to Eagle Bay (NYS C8B)
10 miles from Raquette Lake to Eagle Bay can be reached via the Brown's Tract Road/Uncas Road. ALT ROUTE: Dillon Rd. to the abandoned railroad tracks and continue to the Uncas Road. Turn left on the Uncas Road to Eagle Bay connecting to Big Moose Road and to the Adirondack Railway corridor. Please note! PERMIT REQUIRED TO RIDE TRAILS IN TOWN OF WEBB AND TOWN OF INLET.

RAQUETTE LAKE AREA TRAILS

Long Lake to Newcomb (NYS C8B)
The trail down Goodnow Flowage to Indian Lake is open this season! Take C8B to Newcomb to connect to Indian Lake and the Moose River Plains. These old logging roads are adjacent to private property. Obey all signage and thank area snowmobile clubs and towns for helping get this trail open this season!

Long Lake to Newcomb (NYS C8B)
16.0 mi. to Newcomb. This trail is accessed via Tarbell Hill Road from the Lake. The trail roughly parallels Route 28N to 28N on the County Line where it picks up the trail maintained by the Town of Newcomb. Top off your tanks in Long Lake before taking this excursion.

N. Point Road is extremely cautionary as it will be observed as the Raquette River flows in from the South before the Canoe Carry. RIDE AT YOUR OWN RISK.
