**REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL FOR THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN**

The Town of Long Lake is seeking a qualified planning consultant or planning team to provide the Town with a Comprehensive Plan focusing on an inventory of infrastructure, assets, environment impact, demographic and economic information relevant to important trends in the Town and Hamlets of Long Lake and Raquette Lake. The comprehensive plan will be an expression of the Town’s goals and recommended action to achieve those goals. It will include an outline for orderly growth, providing continued guidance for decision-making and financial planning. The document will focus on immediate and long-range protection, enhancement, growth and development.

The comprehensive plan will provide vision for continued investment in improving resident and visitor experiences as well as identifying sustainability goals, tourism goals, goals to develop a vision for the communities of Long Lake and Raquette Lake and project a vision for these communities 5, 10, 20 years from 2020.

The cost will not exceed \$70,000.00 and will take approximately 12 months to produce. The start date is July 1, 2019; the completion date is June 30, 2020.

The Town has received a \$35,000 grant from NYS Empire State Development to complete the work with additional assistance available from Town staff.
