Youth mentor program grant awarded to Long Lake NY

In August of 2023 the Long Lake N.Y. Parks and Recreation Department has announced it is the recipient of a two-year, \$70,000 grant to support the Adirondack Local Culture Program, a seasonal youth program combining youth mentoring opportunities with the great outdoors at the Mt. Sabattis Recreation Area in the Town of Long Lake, N.Y. This program is funded with the support from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Juvenile Justice, and Delinquency Prevention and will be administrated through the National Recreation and Park Association and the Town of Long Lake.

The Adirondack Local Culture program combines outdoor recreation activities with indoor games, crafts and activities on Mondays and Thursdays through the winter and spring season in conjunction with Long Lake Central School's After School Program. On Sunday's programming expands to include community members and families.

Each youth program is sponsored by a local non-profit, local business, or a featured individual. Youth will have the opportunity to learn about the local community and engage with peers in a safe fun welcoming park environment.

Local organizations and volunteers are invited to provide mentorship by engaging youth with presentations and activities focusing on local Adirondack culture. Organizations in the community signed on to participate include the Long Lake Lions Club, the Long Lake Historical Society, Friends of the Long Lake Library, Long Lake Parks and Recreation Department, and more.

The Youth Mentoring Framework has been developed to help local park and recreation agencies craft their own unique, individualized mentoring programs.

The program is coordinated by Long Lake Geiger Rink Attendant and Educator Rebecca Stoner LaFountain with support from the Long Lake Parks and Recreation Department and the

Long Lake Town Board.

Long Lake Parks and Recreation extends a huge thank you to all the volunteers and guest speakers who participated in the program during the inaugural year and most especially the support of out-going Long Lake Central School Interim Superintendent Dave Snide. The collaborative effort, coordination and support from Long Lake Central School was integral to the on-going success of the program. Parks and Recreation looks forward to the second year of the program which will start in October 2024.

Birding Hike with Joan Collins

On Tuesday, August 6th, 2024, join Joan Collins for a birding walk on a railbed through wonderful wetlands and forests! The old railbed travels along Vanderwhacker Brook at the beginning of the walk with fascinating marshes and ponds (and interesting plants!). There are also boreal forest sections. We will hike at the pace of the group and our birding, likely walking a few miles

round trip. Some of the species we may find include: Wood Duck; American Black Duck; Hooded and Common Mergansers; Black-billed Cuckoo; Ruby-throated Hummingbird; Virginia Rail; American Bittern; Great Blue Heron; Broad-winged Hawk; Belted Kingfisher; Black-backed Woodpecker; Eastern Kingbird; Olive-sided Flycatcher; Eastern Wood-Pewee; Yellow-

bellied Flycatcher; Alder Flycatcher; Least Flycatcher; Eastern Phoebe; Boreal Chickadee; Winter Wren; Swainson's Thrush; Hermit Thrush; White-throated Sparrow; Swamp Sparrow; Rusty Blackbird; and many warblers including Ovenbird, Northern Waterthrush, Black-and-white Warbler, Nashville Warbler, Common Yellowthroat, Northern Parula, Magnolia Warbler, Blackburnian Warbler, Black-throated Blue Warbler, Yellow-rumped Warbler, Black-throated Green Warbler, and Canada Warbler. Participants will meet at Overlook Park in Newcomb (restrooms at this location) at 6:30 a.m. and we will car-caravan to a dirt parking area up the hill from the railbed. St. William's on Long Point: Thursday evenings around the world and into classical music

Can a person grow up summers in Raquette Lake and end up traveling around the world with a message of hope? On Thursday August 8th we have a special presentation by Dr. Glen Martin called "From Raquette Lake to Around the World". Glen's great grandfather was the first "bus" driver in Raquette Lake. Actually, he was the teacher and the guide boat driver, as he rowed the guide boat around the lake to pick up the school students and take them to school at Long Point, before the town had moved to its current site. Glen's family home on Indian Point had no electricity until 1992. And yet, as a college professor he began to travel. He has been to Barcelona, Ghana, Costa Rica, Japan, Bangkok, India, and Sri Lanka among the many places. He returned here every summer of his life, and he will talk about his experiences of growth from local to global travel and citizenship. He will read short pieces from his books and poetry, talk about the meaning of global citizenship, and show a Power-Point of some of the places he has traveled including sharing music from Venezuelan women.

As part of our Thursdays on the Lake Programs, on Thursday, August 15th, we are pleased to offer a Classical Music Trio. Introducing Daniel Colallillo, Ryan Foley, and Kyle Foley as they share their passion for classic, romantic, and

modern forms of composition for a piano trio, aka piano, violin, and cello.

W.A. Mozart: Piano Trio No. 5 in C major, K. 548 Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart needs no introduction, but in June of 1788, he did need money. In a letter to his friend Michael Puchberg of Vienna, Mozart wrote, "I beg you to lend me a few hundred gulden at least till tomorrow, as my landlord... was so importunate that, in order to avoid trouble, I was obliged to pay him on the spot, and this has put me to great embarrassment!" As composing was one of Mozart's most important sources of income, he may well have been banking on the Piano Trio in C major to help with his arrears. At the end of the same letter, he wrote, "P.S. —When are we to have a little music at your house again?— I have written a new trio!—" *Letters of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart - Hans Mersmann.

Clara Schumann Andante from Piano Trio in G Minor, Op. 17 Clara Wieck Schumann was born 1819 into a musically well known family. She began touring Europe as a remarkable pianist at 11 years old and composing at 14 years old. She married Robert Schumann in 1840 and by 1846, she had the first 4 children of 8 total. With her husband's mental health problems and hospitalization, composing and performing were essential. However, make no mistake, she was considered one of the best pianists of the

era. She spent 61 years on concert tours frequently as a piano trio. She presented premiers of both her husband's and Brahms's compositions. This only Piano Trio by CS is considered her greatest, most mature 4 movement work. Please appreciate the charm and enrichment contributed by the violin and cello with the piano.

Dmitri Shostakovich: Piano Trio No. 2 in E minor, Op. 67 Russian composer Dmitri Shostakovich (1906 - 1975) was no stranger to morose and tragic themes. During the course of his life he walked a never-ending tightrope between dissidence towards and appeasement of the Soviet government. While the second piano trio does not explicitly contain political leanings, it is still in keeping with Shostakovich's dark and brooding m.o. Completed toward the end of World War II, it is dedicated to his good friend Ivan Sollertinsky, who died at 41 while Shostakovich was in the process of composing. These musicians have played in Carnegie Hall among other places. They are looking forward to playing here in the mountains.

We are pleased that we once again have public transportation from the town dock to St. William's for our programs this year! Our thanks to Raquette Lake Camps for supplying the barge, and to Mike Bartow, who will be our captain. Be at the dock by 5:30, as it is first come, first

serve. The boat will leave at 6:00. Please check our website or Facebook for further information. If you have a boat on Raquette Lake, you may also enjoy the concert from the comfort of your boat. You can also dock at the church and then join us inside the church or sit on the lawn with your own blanket. The concerts will start at 6:30 and last for about an hour. Remember we will have more pies to raffle! Rain location will be at Raquette Lake School or on August 15th, the Raquette Lake Chapel. We are excited to welcome this line up of people to share their gifts with us. This project is made possible with funds from the Statewide Com-

Boat Wash rules and information

Boats, trailers, waders, and other fishing equipment can spread invasive species from waterbody to waterbody unless properly cleaned after use. Regulations now prohibit boats from launching from or leaving DEC launch sites without first draining the boat and cleaning the boat, trailer and equipment of visible plant and animal material. Many New York counties, towns, and villages also have laws in place that prohibit the transport of aquatic invasive species on boats, trailers, and equipment. Although some invasive species such as water milfoil are visible to the human eye, many others are too small to be easily noticed.

To avoid spreading invasive species please follow the following guidelines or view our step-by-step guide to cleaning your boat and equipment:

- 1) Inspect your boat and equipment and remove any visible mud, plants, fish, or animals before moving it.
- 2) Drain all water from equipment before transporting.
- 3) Clean and dry anything that comes into contact with water including boats, trailers, waders, bait buckets and other boating and fishing equipment. Boaters should pay careful attention to bait and live wells and bilge areas that are difficult to dry.
- 4) Disinfect if you cannot dry equipment.
- 5) Never release plants, fish, or animals into a body of water unless they came out of that body of water.

Many public boat launches have boat stewards present on-site to help you check your watercraft and gear for aquatic plants and animals.

Bob Milne performs Thursday, August 15th

Bob Milne returns to Long Lake, NY on Thursday, August 15th, Long Lake Town Hall, 1204 Main Street at 7:30pm. Tickets are \$15 per person. This is a do not miss concert. If you have not yet seen Mr. Milne perform, do not miss your chance. This is a one-of-a-kind performer, and we are lucky to have him make Long Lake one of his prime stops along his summer tour. This intimate show features the talents of a man who learned to play piano by ear. His incredible skill and his storytelling make this a one-of-a-kind concert experience.

Bob Milne is considered to be the best ragtime/boogie-woogie pianist in the world. Mr. Milne is an active Musical Ambassador for the United States Dept. of State, and has performed numerous times in Japan, including the Okinawan Islands and Hokkaido. He has also performed in this capacity for members of the Swiss Parliament at the U.S. Embassy in Berne.

Mr. Milne's natural ability to hear and play music goes back to his early childhood. He makes the statement, "I knew how to play a piano long before I ever started. Just push down the notes

you hear, and the instrument will play itself. Can't everyone do this?" He considers either looking at music or practicing to be cheating.

A French horn player in High School, he went to the prestigious Eastman School of Music at the age of 17, and then became assistant First Horn in the Rochester Philharmonic at age 19. After the symphony concerts the students all went and hung out in local places. When the piano player didn't show up at a sing-along saloon one night, Mr. Milne filled in. They hired him on the spot. He continued playing the horn until age 21, then became a full-time piano player in the Detroit area, playing seven nights a week for twenty-five years.

Playing in concert halls now since 1991, Mr. Milne plays worldwide every year. A comment often heard following one of his performances is unbelievable. He teaches music history at various universities around the country and is also the founder and director of the Frankenmuth Ragtime Festival in Michigan.

Mr. Milne has been averaging somewhere in the area of 250 performances per year. He is highly sought after for both his incredible piano playing and easy-going, modest presentations. He claims, "If I have been given any ability at all, it is my duty to honor it by trying to improve that ability every time I perform." The list of music festivals he's appeared at is extensive. They include the Scott Joplin Ragtime Festival (Sedalia, Missouri), the Montreal Jazz Festival, the Eau Claire Ragtime Festival, Sacramento Ragtime Festive, plus many others.

As Bob says, "You can't educate a piano," he says, "but you can educate yourself to know everything about it."

Bear Activity

Bears have been very active in Long Lake, NY and in our surrounding Adirondack communities.

To minimize the risk of a bear encounter the NYSDEC recommends taking your garbage to the dump daily.

Do not store garbage in cans outside of your homes.

Remove Bird Feeders
Secure Garbage to Prevent Human-Bear Conflicts.

Clean all outdoor grills, do not leave any residue behind

Do not store or leave pet food outdoors

Bears are opportunistic feeders and will remember where they find easy food, then return to that location frequently

Intentionally feeding black bears is illegal.

Anything with an odor can attract a bear.

Mask garbage odors with ammonia-soaked rags

Remove grease cans and filters after each use

Do not operate fridges outside or on outdoor porches -bears can smell what is inside

While camping:

Keep your campsite as clean as possible

Do not leave coolers or food out at any time.

Do not keep food or scented items in your tent

Treat toiletries as food items.

Clean up after meals immediately.

mediately.

Keep pans/pots/utensils clean when not in use

Do not put grease, diapers, cans bottles or other refuse into a campfire

In Backcountry

Use Bear Resistant Containers - Hoss's has some available to rent or purchase

Pack and eat a minimal amount of food

Cook and eat before dark
Cook away from your campsite

Be neat and clean while cooking, avoid spills

Avoid leftovers

Never leave food unattended

If you have a human/bear conflict

Some situations call for DEC Wildlife staff to go afield to assess or resolve the problem.

These situations include bears causing serious property damage, entering homes or buildings.

If you have a bear conflict and need immediate attention

Brianna's Law

On August 6, 2019, Governor Cuomo signed Brianna's Law. A comprehensive boater education law requiring all power boaters (including those operating sailing vessels with auxiliary power) to complete a boater safety course. Brianna's Law will phase in requirements that all operators of motorized watercraft must complete a state-approved boating safety course. Brianna's Law is named after Brianna Lieneck, an 11-year-old Long Island girl who was killed in a 2005 boating accident. The Governor also directed State Parks to launch a boating safety promotional campaign to remind boaters of the new requirement to take a safety course.

Jetski/PWC Operators: Current requirements are that all PWC/Jetski Operators MUST be certified regardless of age.

Brianna's Law enhances the current requirements as follows:

Applies to all powerboat operators:

~Those born on or after 1/1/1993 currently need a safety certificate

~Those born on or after 1/1/1983 need a safety certificate beginning January 2023.

~Those born on or after 1/1/1978 need a safety certificate beginning January 2024.

~All powerboat operators regardless of age will need a boating safety certificate beginning in January 2025
